### **Legislative Ratings — 2011-2012 Session**

#### Basis for CLT Legislative Ratings — 2011-2012 Session

Citizens for Limited Taxation rates legislators on direct and indirect taxpayer issues for which there were roll call votes.

During the 2011-2012 session we counted tax votes in both branches to roll back the state income tax rate and the sales tax rate to 5%, freeze Unemployment Insurance tax rates. There were votes in the Senate on sales/meals tax holidays, and to treat gaming revenues like budget revenues for the purpose of computing an income tax rate reduction. The House voted on a 2/3 vote requirement for a tax hike, and a state spending limit.

We like legislative reform votes: in the Senate to require that Committee votes be posted online, in the House to not send bills to a "study committee" if the sponsor objects, and to hold legislators' testimony to the first half hour of a hearing, instead of giving them unlimited time ahead of citizens. The Senate voted on creating an independent redistricting commission, and the House on requiring voter IDs. On "transparency," we liked House bills to require the State Auditor to account for every state-funded credit card and make MBTA pensions available on a website.

We counted as "good" votes in both branches to control illegal immigration, and on EBT card reform; we oppose requiring child-care providers to join a union.

On health care: Both branches had votes for a moratorium on new mandated health benefits. The Senate voted on a single payer health plan; this failed, but a last-minute vote on a healthcare "cost containment bill" approximates state socialized medicine. We counted the "Nay" votes as positive.
