Legislators were rated on key taxpayer issues. They got credit when they voted *FOR* keeping the promise to rollback the income tax rate, continuing the phase-out of the capital gains tax, freezing the gas tax, waiving the diesel fuel tax, increasing the charter school cap, requiring a 2/3 vote to spend from the "stabilization fund," reforming "special education," and determining that random stray marks will not disqualify petition signatures. The capital gains, charter school, gas tax freeze and special ed bill passed.

We gave them credit for voting *AGAINST* a deeds transfer tax, the teacher "early retirement" bill, the Fenway Park taxpayer subsidy and eminent domain bill, and the fee hikes in the Big Dig bailout, all of which passed anyhow.
